

## Welcome to the 2020 Magnolia Society Seed Counter

The Magnolia Society International is pleased to announce the Seed Counter is open for business! Once again we are grateful to our members who were able to collect, clean, and contribute seed from a diverse assortment of taxa generated via open pollination, hand crosses, and wild collection. There are quite a few first-time offerings this year, as well as seed from specimens raised from seed distributed in previous year's Seed Counters. It is nice to see the process come full-circle.

All seed received has been stratified and is ready to germinate. Float tests have been performed so that all seed distributed is filled and viable to the best of our knowledge. We cannot guarantee germination. This year we will use sphagnum with seed mailed within the United States, and perlite with seed mailed outside the United State. If an alternate or no substrate would be preferred by inspectors in your country, please let us know ([parrisk@scsc.edu](mailto:parrisk@scsc.edu)).

Thank you for participating in this year's seed counter. By doing so, you are helping promote interest and fund research related to conservation and cultivation of this valuable group of plants.

Please order using our online seed order form - your order and payment will be recorded immediately and the online form automatically calculates the cost. Orders will be filled in the order received; online orders are time-stamped, and you can order online right away versus the delay caused by mailing an order.

### Online Orders (preferred method):

Order online using our website ([www.magnoliasociety.org](http://www.magnoliasociety.org)). Log in with your email address and password - select Members and go to the seed counter page. You will see a link for the seed counter online order form on the right side of that page.

The online order form will total your order and include the postage.

### Mail In Orders (Postal Mail Only)

Orders will be filled in the order received, so we encourage online orders. If you prefer to mail in orders, please send order form and payment to Beth Edward, 3000 Henneberry Rd, Jamesville, NY 13078 USA. We accept checks (in US Dollars) and will also accept credit card information that is sent via postal mail. PLEASE DO NOT SEND EMAIL ORDERS OR CREDIT CARD INFORMATION VIA EMAIL. If you send your order by postal mail, please make sure to include your name and the address where the seeds should be mailed. (Every year we receive at least one order without any identifying information on it). If you would like to receive an email when your order has been received, please include your email address.

For those preferring to handle payment for your order via traditional mail rather than online, you may mail in your order, but please also send a list of your order to [parrisk@scsc.edu](mailto:parrisk@scsc.edu) so these requests can be accounted for at the time our volunteers gather on 3/7/20 to assemble the majority of the orders.

### Order Quantities / Limits

This year we have 3 categories of seeds: Open Pollinated, Wild Collected, and Hand Crosses. You may order as many different types of open pollinated seed as you would like (but not more than one packet of each type). You are limited to two packets each of the Wild Collected and Hand Crosses.

### Pricing

#### Pricing:

Postage – mailed to USA: \$6.50

Postage – mailed outside USA: \$14.00

Open Pollinated– 15 seed per packet for most selections: \$5.00 each

Wild Collected - 10 seed per packet: \$8.00 each (limit 2 packets)

Hand crosses -10 seed per packet: \$8.00 (limit 2 packets)

### HOW TO ORDER YOUR SEEDS ONLINE USING OUR SECURE WEBSITE

Order online using our website ([www.magnoliasociety.org](http://www.magnoliasociety.org)). Go to the bottom of the home page and log in using your email address and password. If you need help with logging in, contact Beth Edward ([beth.edward@gmail.com](mailto:beth.edward@gmail.com)). Once you are logged in, click the "Member" button and go to the seed counter page. On the right hand side of the page, under "related links" you will find a link for Online Seed Ordering. Click the Register button to access the order form. If you do not see a register button, contact Beth Edward. Please make sure your address on the first page of the form is correct! After you place your order online and submit payment you will receive an email acknowledgement.
